Stone, Coal and Gold in the Upper Worth Valley Led by William Varley

The walk will examine the geology and industrial archaeology of Penistone Hill and the Upper Worth Valley. The rocks here give an insight into the past when the area was a huge tropical delta over 300 million years ago. Since the 19th century the natural resources, stone and coal, have been quarried and mined here.
